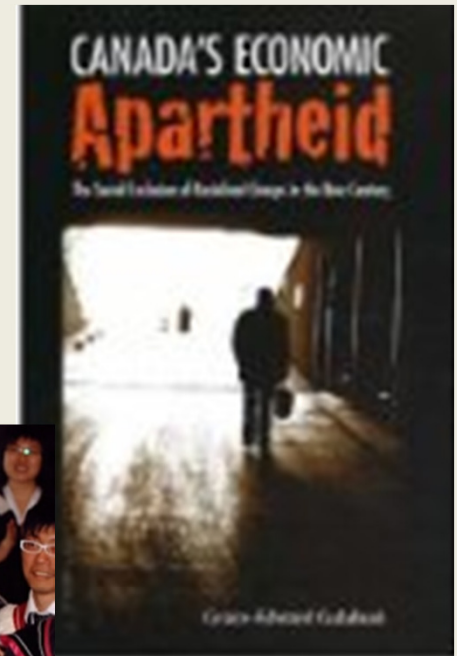
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# Children of Immigrants

- Straight-line assimilation



- Segmented assimilation
  - Triumph
  - Decline



# Purpose

- A comparative analysis of the residential segregation of the children of immigrants in Toronto:
  1. 1<sup>ST</sup>, 2<sup>ND</sup>, 3+ generations
  2. Ethno-racial groups within 2<sup>nd</sup> generation
  3. Evolving segregation of ethno-racial groups
  4. Impacts on social contacts and neighbourhood characteristics

# Impacts of Segregation

## PRO

- Ethnic economy
- Attachment to parents' culture and language

## CON

- Isolates
  - Reduces scope and diversity of social contacts
  - Reduces access to job information
  - Reduces incentive to learn official languages
- ***Poverty***
- ***Stigmatization***

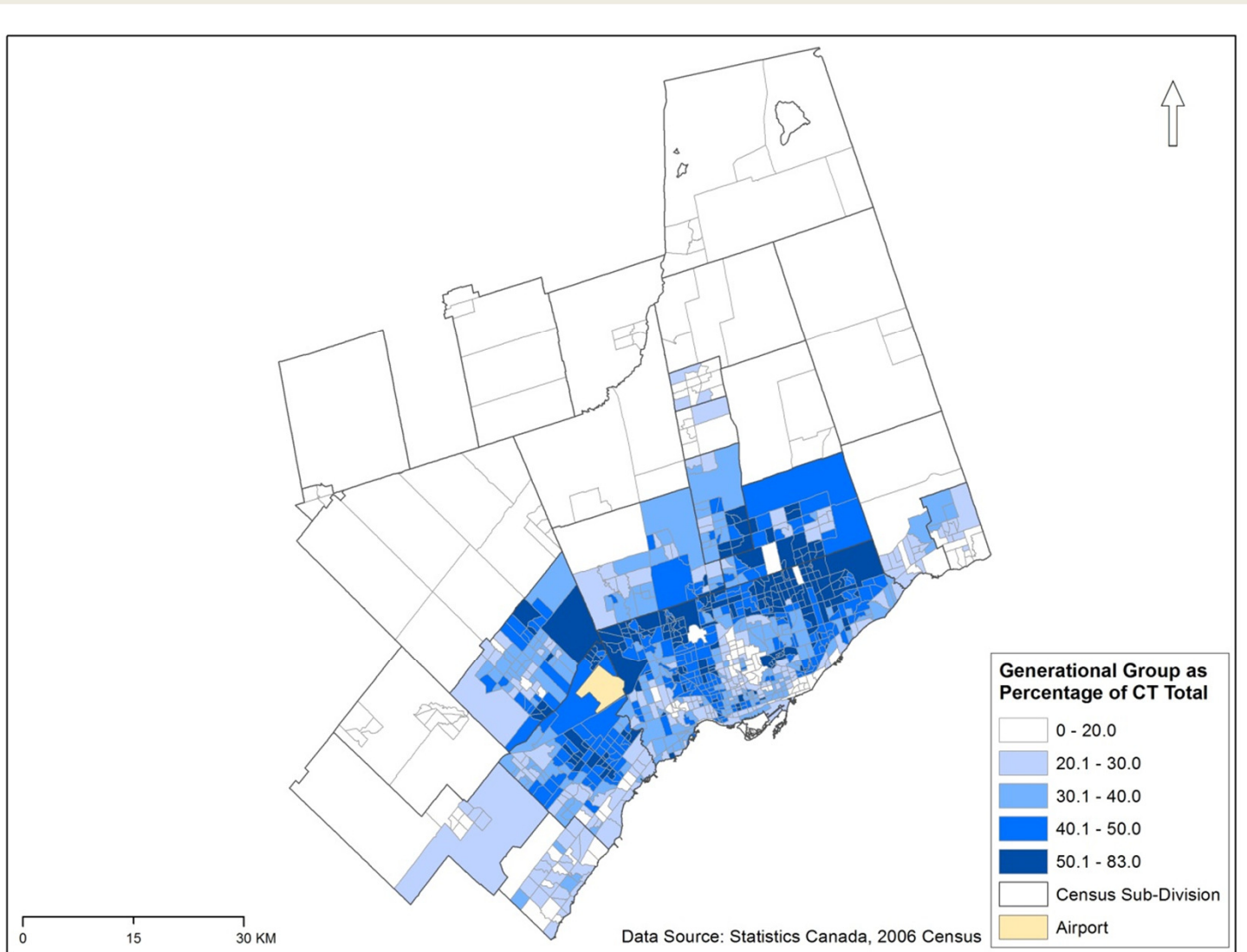
# Empirical Analysis

  - South Asian
- 2006 Census

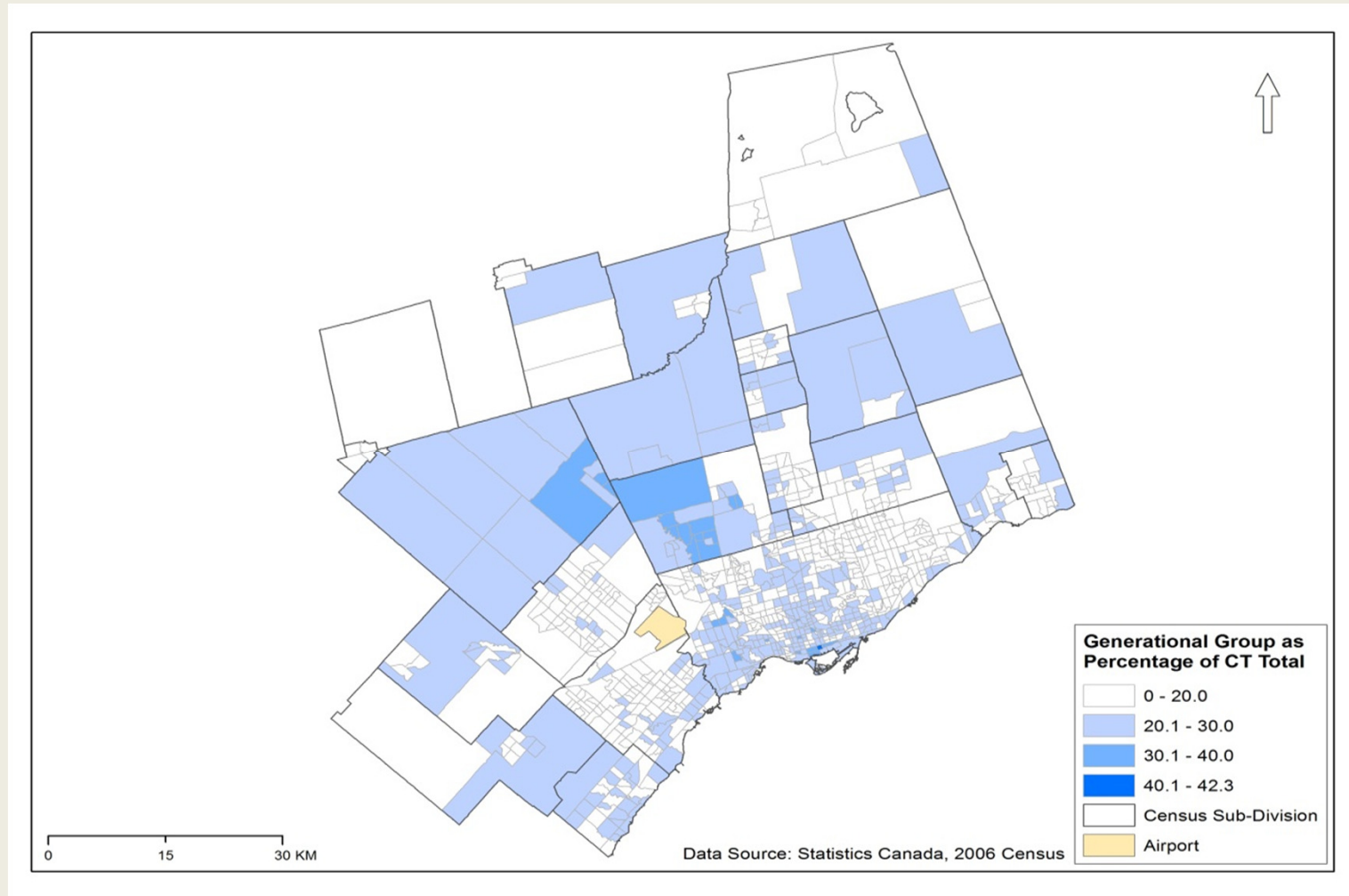

# 1st Generation, Toronto CMA, 2006

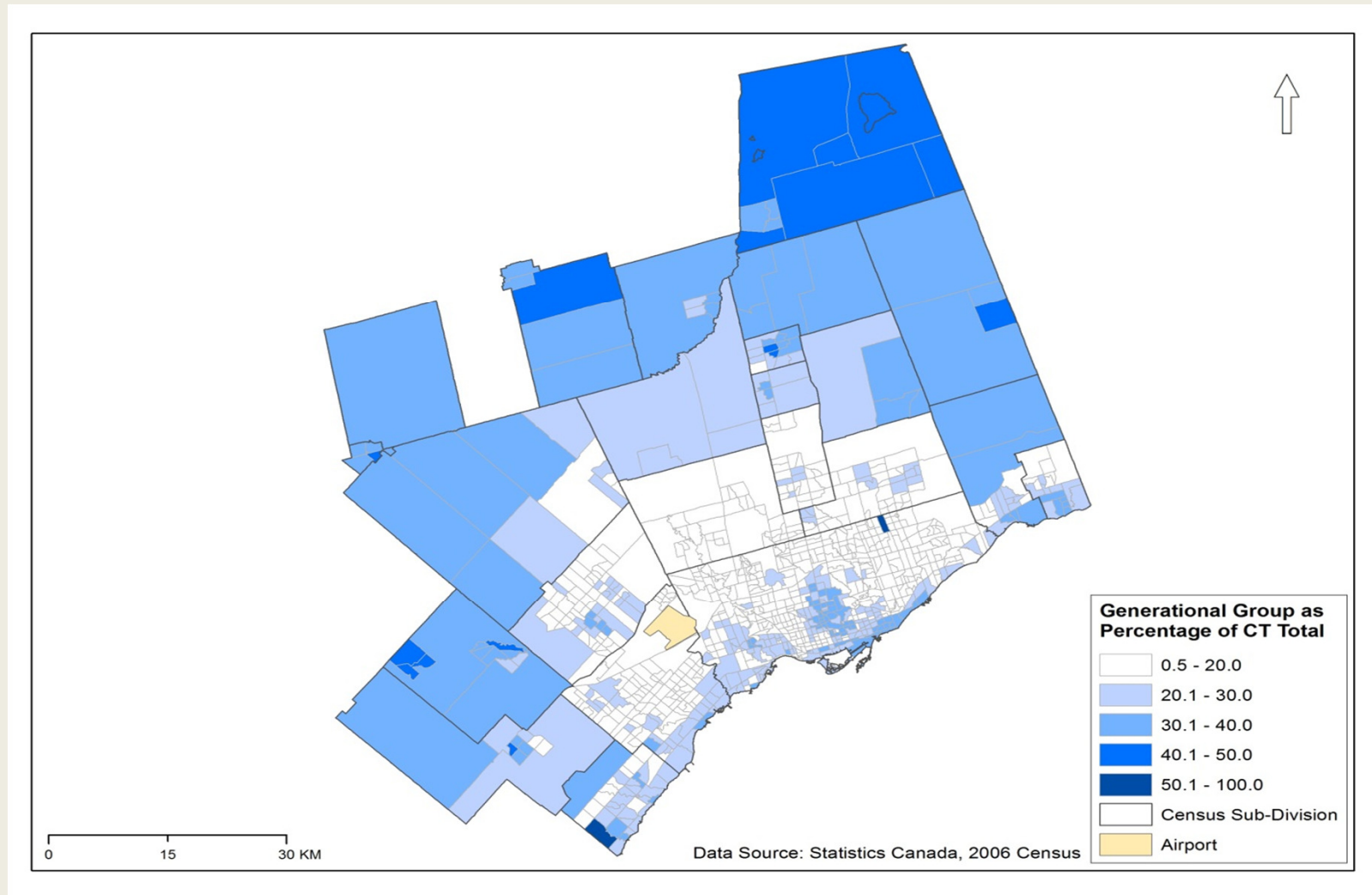


# 2nd Generation, Toronto CMA, 2006



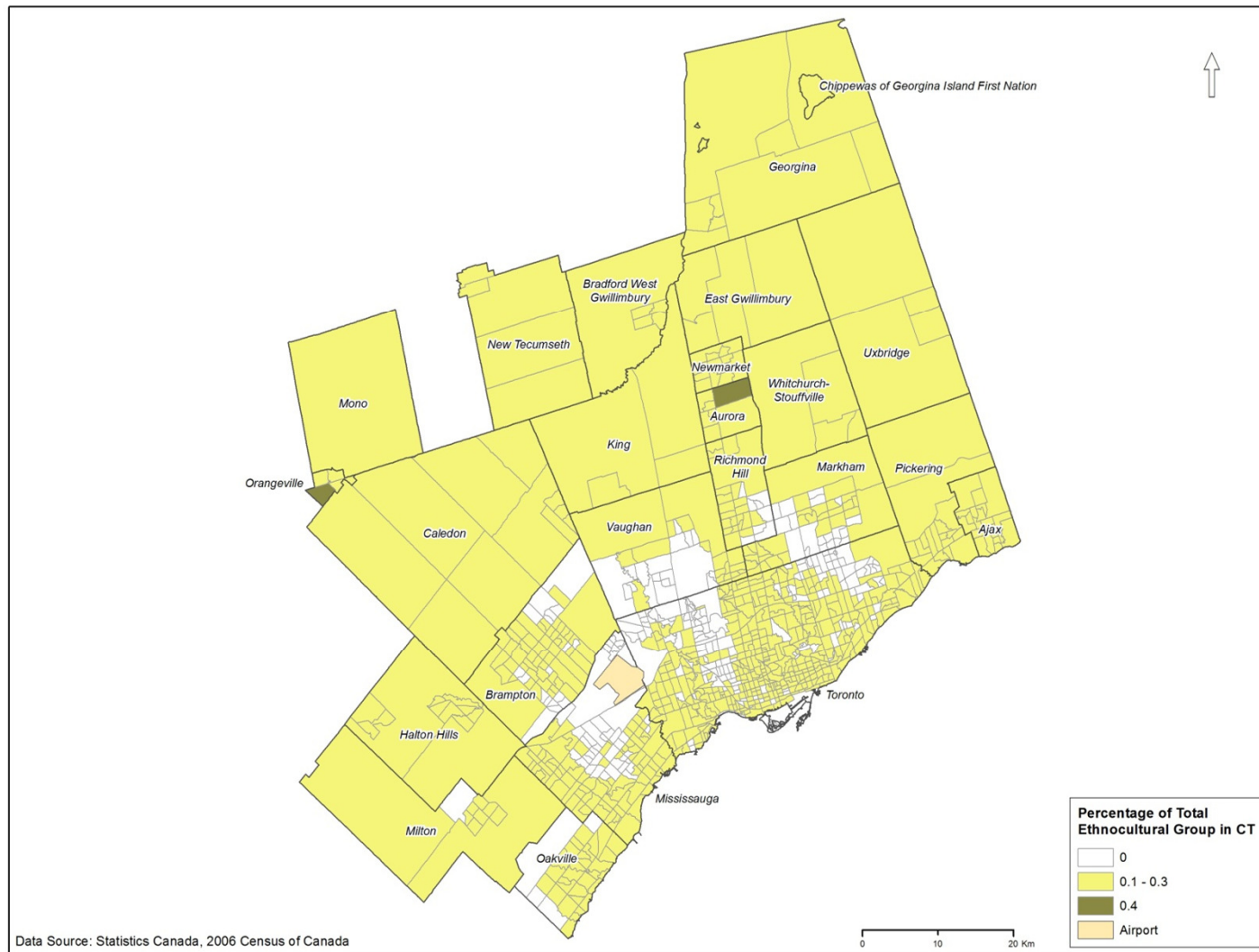


# 3+ Generation, Toronto CMA, 2006

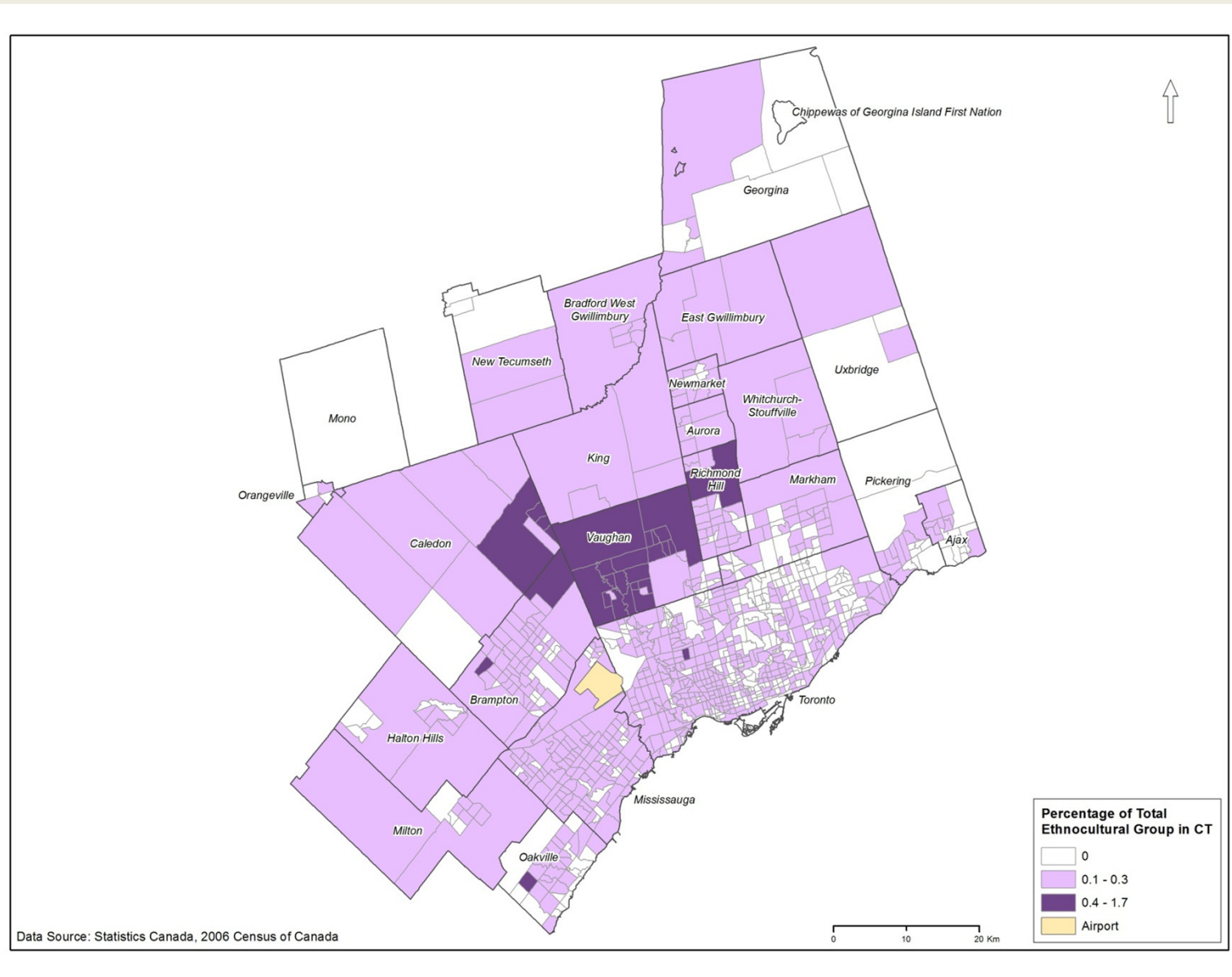




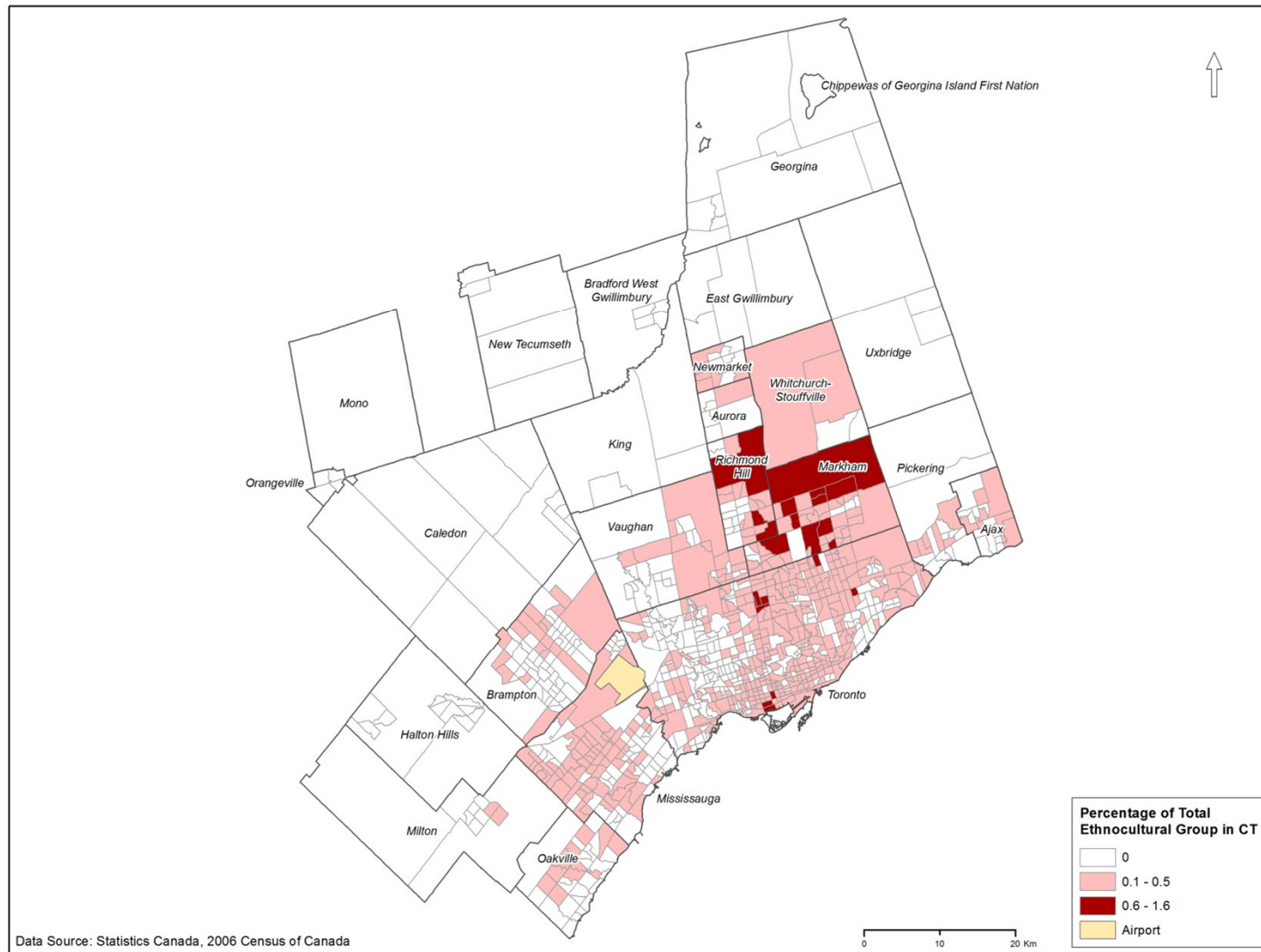
# NW European 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation



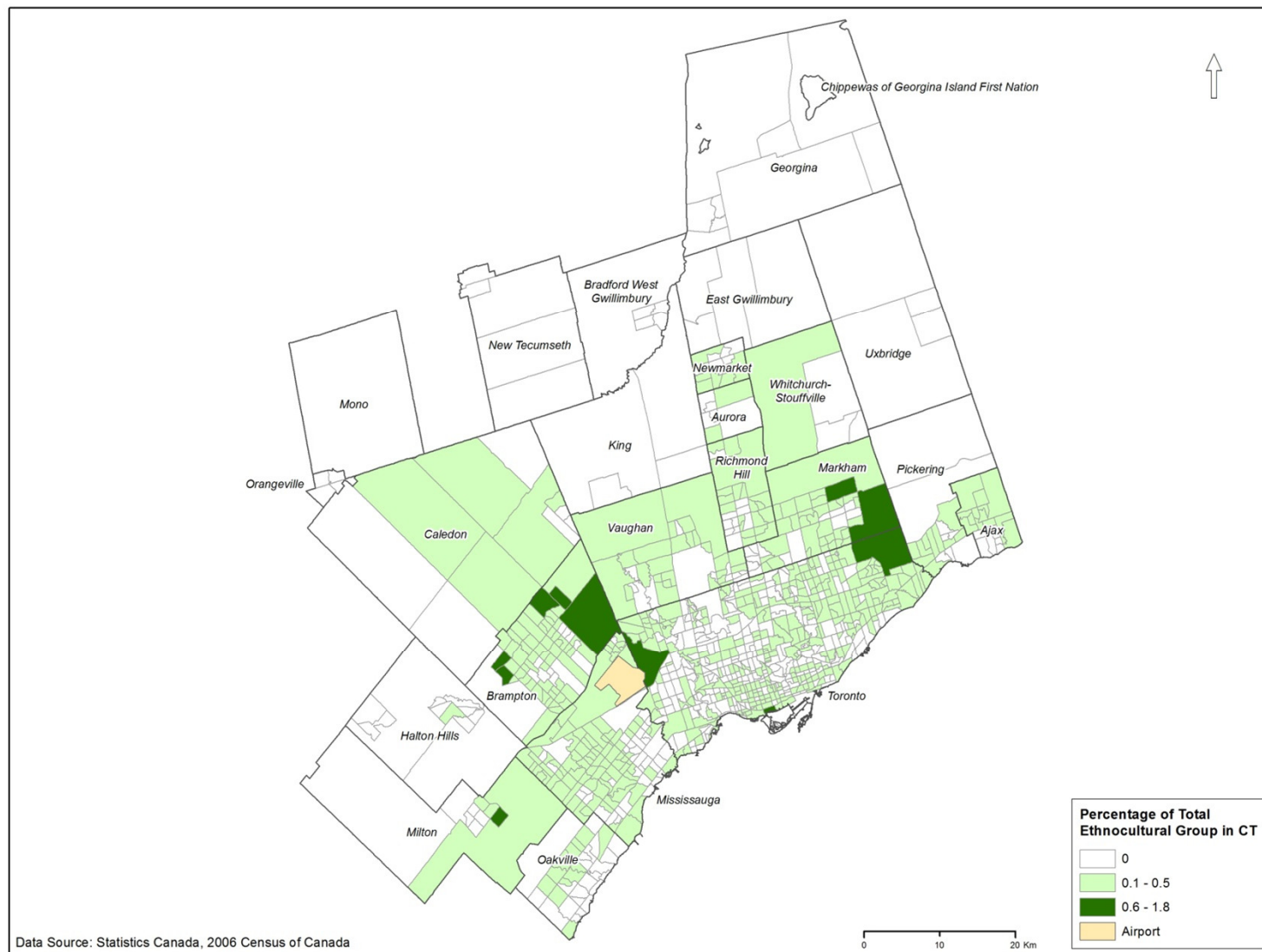
# Southern European 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation



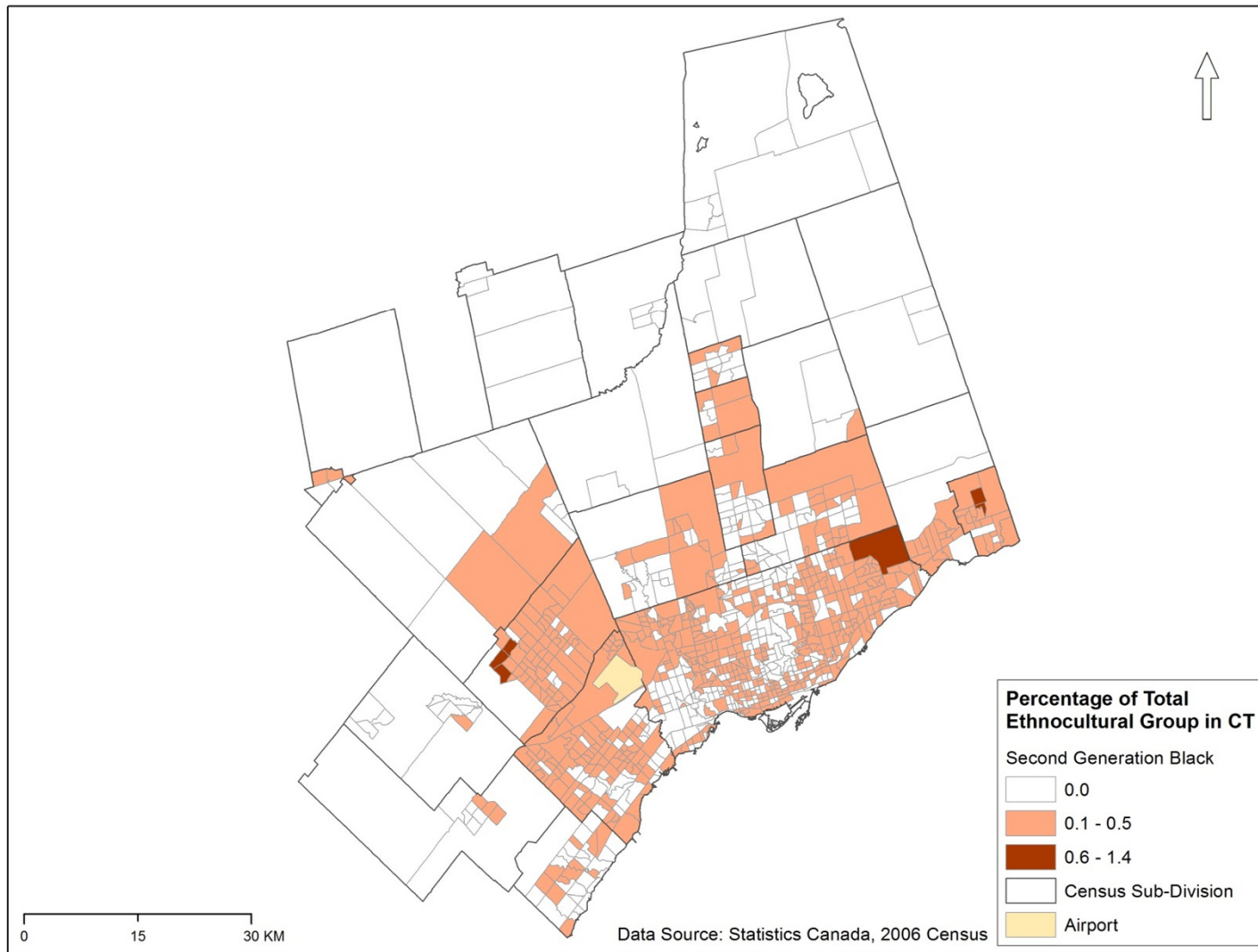
# Chinese 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation



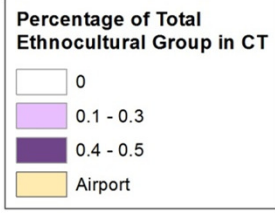
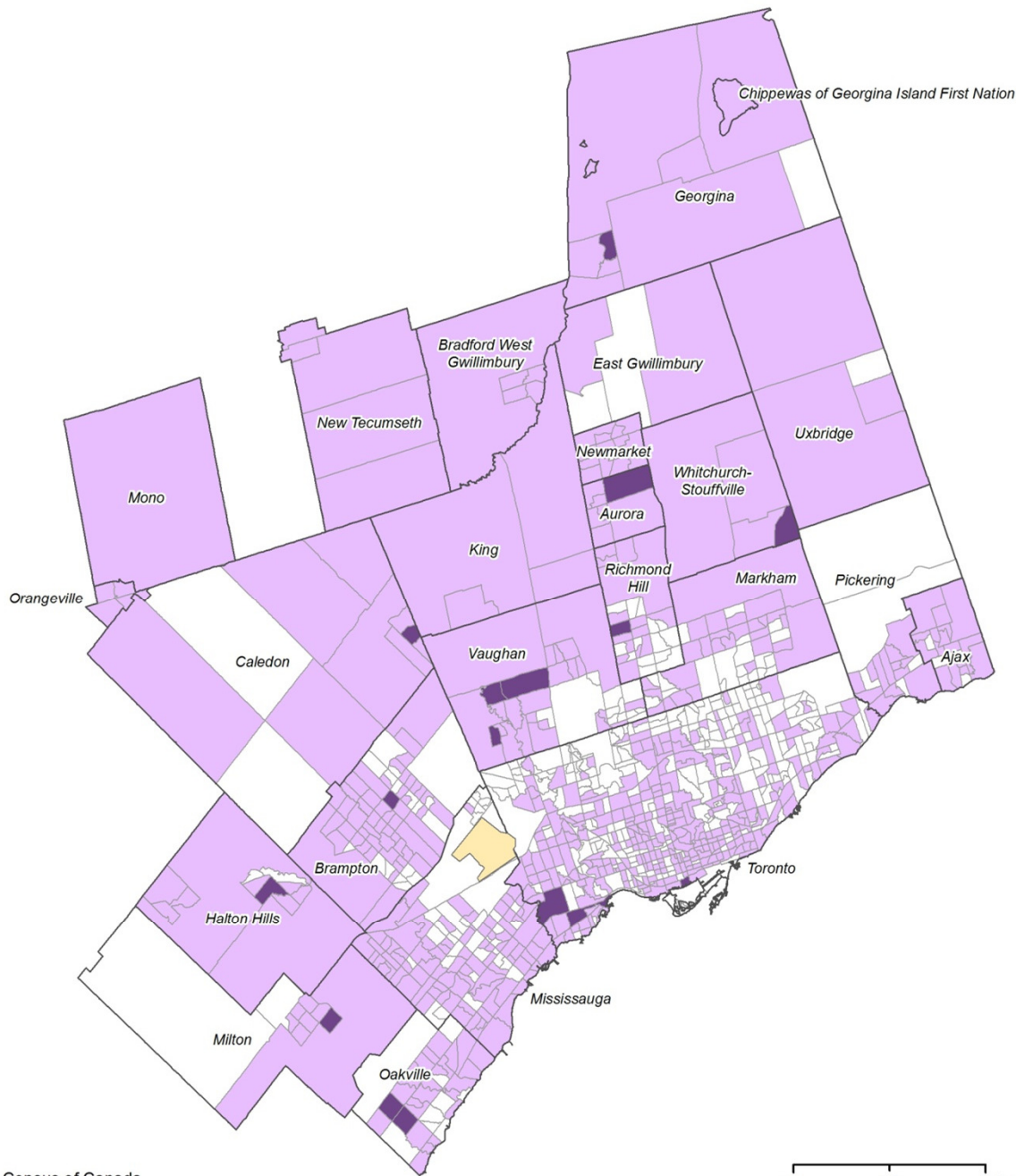

# Preliminary Conclusions

- Some assimilation BUT racial segregation in every generation
- Within generations, avoidance of difference and attraction between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>
- Segregation limits social contacts of racialised minorities in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> generation
- Segregation affects neighbourhood characteristics only where 1<sup>st</sup> generation is concentrated
